INTRODUCTION: RÉAMHRÁ:

FIND is a series of temporary artworks/
installations/events in and around the town of
Castlebar, Co Mayo. The works are installed within
walking distance of each other and found via the
map included in this brochure or by attending the
guided artist tours. The Linenhall Arts Centre will
act as central headquarters/studio for participating
artists and audience alike.

This project is the first collaboration of the
Linenhall Arts Centre and the Mayo County
Council Arts Office Public Art Programme, curated
by Gaynor Seville. The series of temporary
installations are created by Mayo based artists
who applied for the commissions via an open
competition process. The Linenhall Arts Centre
and the project mentors selected the final artists.
The theme of FIND is experience of temporary
work, and documentation and legacy of temporary
work. Artists were encouraged to consider
discreet or 'hidden' works that will be 'unravelling',
or be revealed, via the event tour, and map –
encouraging the audience to search out the work.
The Mayo artists who were selected for the
commissions are Ian Wiczorek, Amanda Rice,
Chris Leach, Nuala Clarke with Crystal Gandrud,
Alice Dixon with Anthony Champa (Exterus) and
Joanna Hopkins.

These artists also had the opportunity to be
mentored and supported by International profile
artists Alice Maher and Aideen Barry during the
development and realisation of their ideas. Alice
had a hugely successful mid career retrospective
at IMMA in 2013 and she has vast experience in
working in installation, site-specific and temporal
art. Aideen Barry has a multi versatile practice,
which spans a range of art forms and approaches,
including sculpture, performance, drawing, and
animation. Aideen also acts and an advocate for
visual artists based in the west of Ireland in her
role as Western Representative for Visual Artists
Ireland. She teaches at the Limerick School of
Art and Design as a Lecturer in Sculpture and
Combined Media.

An accompanying exhibition at the Linenhall, will
expose the studio work and process behind the
production of the artists artworks. The gallery
space will in effect become a living installation of
artist's studios during the month of the exhibition
and audience members throughout the month
will have the opportunity to observe and meet the
artists working in the space.

comhpháirtíochta idir Halla an Línéadaigh agus
Clár na nEalaíon Poiblí de chuid Oifig Ealaíon
Chomhairle Contae Mhaigh Eo faoi chúram
Gaynor Seville. Ealaíontóirí atá bunaithe i Maigh
Eo agus a chuir isteach ar na coimisiúin trí chóras
iomaíochta oscailte a chruthaigh an tsraith
insuiteáin sealadacha. Roghnaigh Ionad Ealaíon
Halla an Línéadaigh agus meantóirí an tionscadail
na healaíontóirí deireanacha. Is iad taithí ar obair
shealadach chomh maith le doiciméadú agus
iarnhairt na hoibre sealadaí na téamaí atá ag
FIND. Spreagadh ealaíontóirí le saothair folaithe
nó mhíntáithe a cheapadh a scaoilfeas a rúin 'go
slítheánta', in imeacht an turais leis an léarscáil – ní
a spreagfas daoine leis na saothair a aimsiú.
Is iad na healaíontóirí as Maigh Eo a roghnaíodh do na
coimisiúin Ian Wiczorek, Amanda Rice, Chris Leach,
Nuala Clarke, Alice Dixon agus Joanna Hopkins.
Bhí an deis ag na healaíontóirí seo meantóireacht
agus tacaíocht a fháil le linn fhorbairt agus
fhioradh a meabhraíochta ó bheirt ealaíontóirí
a bhfuil meas idirnáisiúnta orthu, Alice Maher
agus Aideen Barry. Bhí aishbhreathnú iontach
rathúil ar chéad leath a saol ealaíne ag Alice san
IMMA anuraidh agus tá taithí céadtach oibre
aici le healaín suiteála, suíomhoiriúnaithe agus
ama. Tá cleachtas iloibritheach ag Aideen Barry
a chuimsíonn réim cineálacha ealaíne agus cur
chuige, an dealbhóireacht, léiriú, tarraingt agus
beochan ina measc. Is crann taca í Aideen don
aos amharcealaíne in iarthar na hÉireann mar
chuid dá dualgas agus í ina hIonadaí an Iarthair
d'Amharcealaíontóirí na hÉireann.
Is Léachtóir í i Scoil Ealaíne agus Deartha Luimnigh
mar a mbíonn sí ag teagasc Dealbhóireacht agus
na Meáin Traschárais. Léireoidh taispeántas tionlacain i Halla an
Línéadaigh an saothar stiúideo chomh maith le
próiséas cúl-táirgthe saothair na n-ealaíontóirí.
Déanfar ealaín bheo shuiteála, nó stiúideonna
ealaíontóirí go bunúsach, den dánlann i rith mhí
an taispeántais agus beidh deis ag baill den lucht
féachana i rith na míosa faire ar na healaíontóirí
agus casadh leo i mbun oibre ann.

IAN WIECZOREK

LOCATION:

The passageway linking to the Foyer of the Linenhall Arts Centre from Linenhall Street.

PROJECT OVERVIEW:

The video/audio installation *Everything That Rises Must Converge* presents what appears to be a disembodied regenerating flame, but is in fact footage of a torrent of water. The imagery transcends its physical source and becomes its opposite: water is transformed into fire by way of *trompe l'oeil* alchemy, evoking connotations of spontaneous generation, nuclear fusion, even the Biblical burning bush, and acknowledging Marco Costa's proposal that new technologies are creating conditions for a new kind of expression of the Sublime. The title *Everything That Rises Must Converge* is by way of French philosopher and Jesuit priest Pierre Teilhard de Chardin and his concept that everything in the universe is in a state of evolution towards a maximum level of consciousness.

As an evocation of dynamic energy, the work's location acknowledges and reinforces the status of the Linenhall Arts Centre as a focus for creative/artistic energy and endeavour in the town. The passageway off the main thoroughfare of Linenhall Street adds a dramatic spatial element to the work both visually and aurally, and also a transformed experience of a generally perceived 'dead area' for the passer-by. A sound element is also incorporated into the artwork. The work will be experienced from the street every evening from 6pm to 11pm daily.

FORAMHARC AN TIONSCADAIL:

Léiríonn an físeán/closán suiteáilte *Everything That Rises Must Converge* macasamhail de lasair dhíchollaithe á hathbheochain, ach ar mír scannáin de chaise uisce é ó cheart. Tarchéimníonn na samhlaoidí a bhfoinse fhisiciúil agus glacann a gcodarsnacht chuige féin: déantar tine den uisce le cleas an trompe l'oeil, a mheabhraíonn uathghiniúint, comhleá eithneach, go fiú tor ar lasadh an Bhíobla agus aithníonn maíomh Marco Costa go bhfuil na nuatheicneolaíochtaí ag cruthú cineál eile coinníollacha do chineál ráiteachais nua ar an uasdiamhaire nó an Sublime.

D'eascair an teideal *Everything That Rises Must Converge* ón bhfealsamh Francach, an sagart Íosánach Pierre Teilhard de Chardin agus as a choinceap go bhfuil gach ní san ollchruinne ag éabhlóidiú i dtreo uasleibhéal comhfheasa.

Aithníonn agus treisíonn loc an tsaothair ar mhodh fuinniúil bríomhar gradam Ionad Ealaíon Halla an Línéadaigh mar lárionad do dhúthracht 7 d'fhuinneamh cruthaitheach/ealaíne an bhaile. Cuireann an bealach siúil ón bpríomhshráid ag Sráid Halla an Línéadaigh agus gné dhrámatúil na háite leis an saothar go feiceálach agus ar an gcluais, chomh maith le mothú na háite a bhí 'marbh' a bheith athmhúscailte don té a shiúlfas tríd. Braithfear an saothar ar an tsráid gach tráthnóna óna 6 i.n. go 11 i.n. ar bhonn laethúil.

AMANDA RICE

LOCATION:

Live Tug of War on the Mall on 29th of March.
Archive: For the month of April at the Linenhall.

PROJECT OVERVIEW:

Active from 1942-1981 Western Hats Ltd. was a significant economic presence and major employer in Castlebar for four decades. Amanda Rice has been working closely with the former employees of Western Hats in compiling a body of research on this prominent local company. As part of FIND she focuses on a fascinating discovery of a photograph of the factory's all-ladies tug-of-war team which relates to a one-off event that took place in Castlebar in 1958. Through contemporary accounts gathered from participants and eyewitnesses, Rice will re-stage the event with the aid of the relatives from the original team on The Mall in Castlebar - the original site of the 1958 event.

By comparing varied and conflicting versions of the event, disparities and distortions associated with re-constructive memory are revealed. Thus the re-staged tug-of-war is not so much a literal re-enactment as a fictitious account that reflects the subjectivity of recollected history. It seeks to act as celebratory event chronicling a forgotten and seemingly arbitrary trace of a major contributor to Castlebar's industrial and social history.

The artist acknowledges with warmest thanks local historians Ernie and Susanna Sweeney, all of the former employees and relatives of Western Hats, St. Josephs Secondary School Transition Years and the Connaught Tug-of-War Clubs for their generous assistance in the realisation of this project.

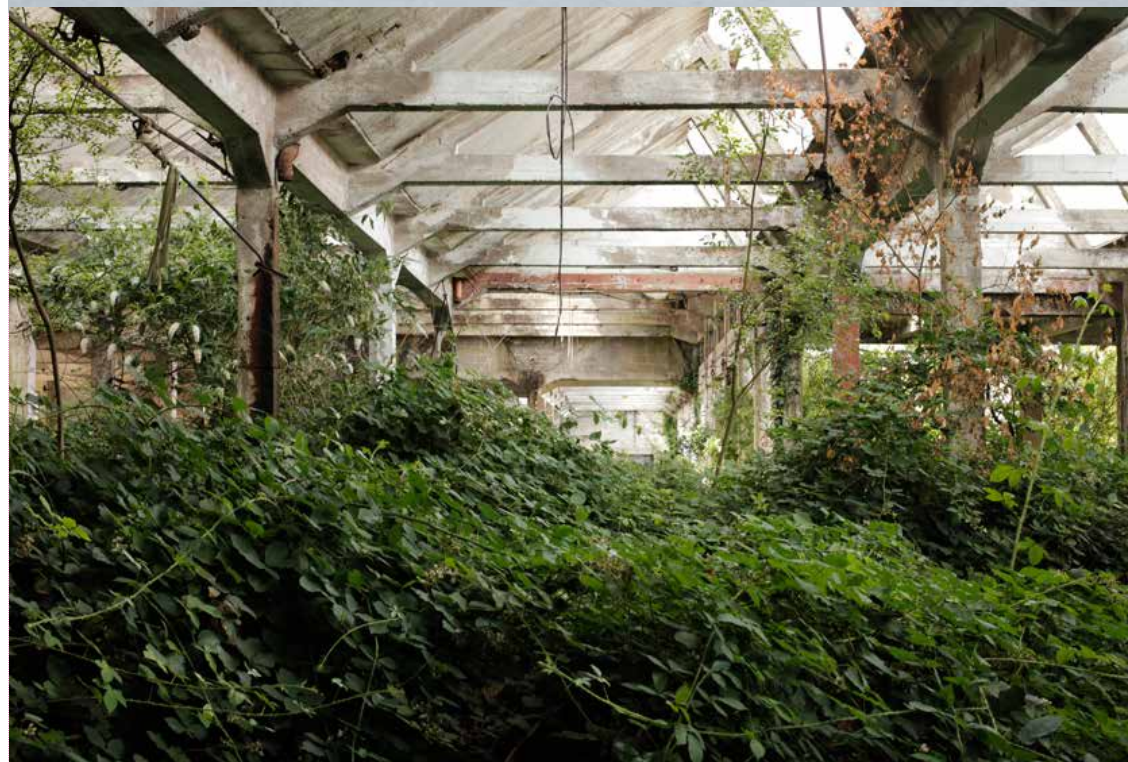

FORAMHARC AN TIONSCADAIL:

B'údar suntasach geilleagair agus b'fhostóir mór i gCaisleán an Bharraigh é Western Hats Ltd. ar feadh daichead bliain (1942-1981). Bhí Amanda Rice ag obair go dlúth le hiarfhostaithe de chuid Western Hats chun meall taighde a thiomsú faoin gcomhlacht suntasach áitiúil seo. Díróinn sí ar son FIND ar fhionnachtain iontach, grianghraf d'fhoireann tarraingthe téide ban, a bhain le himeacht aon uaire a reáchtáladh i gCaisleán an Bharraigh i 1958. Trí chuntais chomhaimseartha a bailíodh ó rannpháirtithe agus ó fhinnéithe, athreáchtálfaidh Rice an t-imeacht le cuidiú ó ghaolta na foirne bunaithe ar an Meal i gCaisleán an Bharraigh – bunsuíomh an teagmhais i 1958.

Tugtar chun léargais difríochtaí agus saobhadh na cuimhne ath-inchiallaithe trí chodarsnaí agus ilghnéitheacht cuntais an imeachta a chur i gcomórtas. Ní athchruthú fíor dá bhrí sin a bheas san atarraingt téide chomh mór is a bheas ina cuntas mar dhea a léireoidh suibíachtúlacht na staire ar athchuímhne. Beidh sé ag iarraidh bheith ina imeacht comórtha a dhéanfas trácht ar rian treallach, ba dhóigh leat, rannpháirtí mór i stair shóisialta agus tionsclaíochta Chaisleán an Bharraigh.

Admhaíonn an t-ealaíontóir go bhfuil sí faoi chomaoin mhór ag lucht staire áitiúil Ernie agus Susanna Sweeney, gach iarfhostaí is a ngaolta as Western Hats, lucht Idirbhliana Mheánscoil Naomh Iosaef agus ag Cumainn Tarraingthe Téide Chonnacht as a gcuidiú flaithiúil leis an tionscadal seo a chur i gcrích.



CHRIS LEACH

LOCATION:

Various.

PROJECT OVERVIEW:

Chris's art practice over the last few years has consistently been about dialogues of scale and perspective. An aspect of recent work has been concerned with highly detailed miniature drawings of cityscapes around the world.

One of the main concerns in the work is how our psychological understanding of the world is formulated by not only direct experience but a sense of space and scale, our ability to navigate the world, the physical parameters of our own personal journeys.

For the FIND project Chris has engaged with a number of businesses and organisations around the centre of Castlebar. He interviewed individuals in each location to find out about the journeys that they have undertaken around the world. He is interested in how those physical relations overlap and build connections both for the individual concerned and in their understanding of how the world is constructed and how those connections relate to the local social structure. Miniature drawings of each location have been produced. As the work is very small scale, the works are installed discreetly within a particular environment so that although not immediately apparent they require a degree of investigation to find them. For the accompanying exhibition at the Linenhall Arts Centre, he will be displaying the background and research information regarding each of the drawings. This work would seek to outline for the audience the wider conceptual basis of the work and would also include transcripts of interviews with each participant outlining the reasons for choosing their particular locations, along with images and accompanying documentation. This work would form an integral part of the 'complete' artwork, allowing me to highlight aspects and information that although perhaps inferred in the drawings would clarify and expand on the research information gathered from the project. He will be exhibiting again at Claremorris Gallery this year in a joint show with Brian Fay, and will be represented at the Hong Kong Affordable Art Fair.

Ba é idirghabháil an toise agus na dearcasachta phríomhchleachtas Chris i dtólamh sna blianta deireanacha seo. Bhain gné amháin dá shaothar ar na mallaibh le mionlíniúcháí iontach mionsonraithe de dhreacha cathracha mórthimpeall an domhain. Ar cheann de chroispéiseanna an tsaothair is ea an dóigh nach trí thaithí dhíreach amháin a mhúnlaímid ár dtuiscint aigneolaíochta ar an saol, ach go múnlaítear sinn trí mhothú spáis is tomhais, trínár gcumas stiúrtha sa saol 7 trí thoisí ár n-aistear pearsanta saoil.

Don tionscadal FIND, chuaigh Chris i dteagmháil le roinnt gnólachtaí agus eagraíochtaí thart ar lár Chaisleán an Bharraigh. Chuir sé agallamh ar dhaoine ag gach láthair le fáil amach faoi na haistir a dtug siad fúthu timpeall an domhain. Is spéis leis an dóigh a fhorluíonn na gaoil sin ar a chéile agus an dóigh a thógann siad naisc don duine áirithe mar aon lena dtuiscint ar dhéanamh an domhain agus ar an dóigh a mbaineann na naisc sin le déanamh phobal na háite. Rinneadh miontarraingtí de gach suíomh. Tharla gur saothar miontoisí atá i gceist, suitear ar mhodh rúndiamhair iad in ionaid áirithe sa dóigh nach léir caol díreach iad ach go nglacfaidh sé roinnt saibhseála le hiad a aimsiú. Don taispeántas a ghabhann leis in Ionad Ealaíon Halla an Línéadaigh, beidh léiriú ar chúlra agus ar an eolas taighde a bhain le chaon cheann de na tarraingtí. Ba mhian leis an léiriú seo éirim bhunús an tsaothair a achoimriú don lucht féachana agus chuimseodh sé freisin tras-scríbhinní d'agallaimh le gach rannpháirtí ag míniú cén fáth ar roghnaigh sé/sí na hionaid ar leith, chomh maith leis na hiomhánna agus cáipéisí a bhain leo. Ba dhlúthchuid an léiriú seo den saothar 'iomlán' ealaine, léiriú a ligfeadh dó gnéithe agus eolas a thabhairt chun suntais, nithe b'fhéidir nach dtabharfaí ach leid fúthu sna tarraingtí, shoiléireoidís agus chuirfidís leis an eolas taighde a bailíodh ón tionscadal.

Woven Found, an installation of linen flags flying over Castlebar's Castle Street, celebrates the boom times of the linen industry. Unfolding local history through the interwoven play of image and word, the flags offer non-linear insight into the processes and vivid idioms of the linen world. Each flag reveals a story of the production of linen and its larger significances to the human experience. The installation explores the many ways in which a mundane industry reflects a specialness of place with a profound mystery all its own.

ALICE DIXON & ANTHONY CHAMPA (EXTERUS)

LOCATION:

Ellison Street.

PROJECT OVERVIEW:

“between the raindrops” from Exterus is a light based installation that plays with the façade of an unoccupied building inviting the public to interact in an accessible format. As the piece is subtle and not strikingly obvious as a work of art it invokes the natural curiosity inside each person to look closer and perhaps play with the work.

Empty buildings in the cities and towns have become commonplace, these buildings are seen as dysfunctional and lost architecture and as we begin to stop noticing them they become invisible. By bringing life into these empty buildings on a temporary basis it changes the urban landscape and can have a lasting effect on the people who engage with it.

Using light was the perfect solution to reactivating empty and disused space due to its association with warmth and habitation. The act of passers-by triggering and essentially becoming part of the piece unknowingly, literally lighting up the building, adds a perfect element of surprise and is an interesting document of how many people are aware of their surroundings and the space they move through routinely. The piece will be visible in the evening from twilight.

FORAMHARC AN TIONSCADAIL:

Insuiteán solasbhunaithe a imríonn ar éadan foirgnimh fholaimh atá in “between the raindrops” le Exterus. Iarrann sé ar an bpobal idirghníomhú i bhformáid inrochtana.

Tharla gur mín an saothar agus nach suntasach soiléir mar shaothar ealaine é, dúisíonn sé fiosracht aiceanta in achán duine é a ghrinniú agus b'fhéidir, imirt leis an saothar.

Is coitianta foirgnimh folmha sna cathracha is sna bailte móra. Meastar iad a bheith mífheidhmiúil agus mar ailtireacht chailte agus de réir mar a chaillimid spéis iontu éiríonn siad dofheicthe. Trí bheocht a thabhairt isteach sna foirgnimh seo ar bonn sealadach, aithrítear dreach na cathrach agus is féidir tionchar buan a imirt ar na daoine a théann i ngleic leis.

Ba é an imirt solais an réiteach ab fhearr d'athbheochain spáis fholaimh i ngeall ar an mbaint a bhí aige le teas agus le cónaí. Cuireann gluaiseacht daoine thar bráid go gleoite le gné an iontais óir is iad i ndáiríre mar chuid den saothar, i ngan fhios dóibh féin, a splancann an foirgneamh faoi laom solais, agus is taifead spéisiúil an líon daoine a bhraitheann an t-imshaol agus an áit a ngluaiseann siad tríd go rialta.

JOANNA HOPKINS

LOCATION:

Front Window, Patrick Fahys' Giftware, Main St. Archive - Castlebar Cinema archive for the month of April at the Linenhall.

PROJECT OVERVIEW:

Hopkins has carried out a thorough research project gathering information from the public, including interviews, images and newspaper articles referencing one of Castlebar's first Silent Cinemas, the Star Picture Palace. Located on Main St. from 1919 to 1923, it was situated behind what is now Patrick Fahy's Gift and Hardware Shop.

The silent cinemas in the 1920's featured local musicians who played improvised music to accompany the screenings of the films. Hopkins will utilise the still existing space to create a piece of film work that pays homage to a local Pianist, Grace Delaney, who played in the cinema. A specially commissioned piece of original music by Grace's great grand daughter will be performed, referencing the 1918 Irish film 'Knocknagow', the first film that was screened in the Star Cinema.

This revised and playful merging of silent films and music intends to pay tribute to the local musicians who played here and to uncover the hidden cinematic history of this building. The film work will be revealed through a specially adapted 'invisible' screen, which the audience must seek out in order to view the work.

Hopkins will use the Gallery Space at the Linenhall for the month of April as an open studio to further research the history of cinemas and film in Castlebar, and invites the public to contribute with stories, images and articles.

FORAMHARC AN TIONSCADAIL:

Chuir Hopkins tionscadal taighde ceart críochnaithe i gcrích ag tiomsú eolais ó na daoine, a chuimsigh agallaimh, íomhánna agus gearthóga nuachtáin a thagair do cheann de chéad Bhalbhphictiúrlanna Chaisleán an Bharraigh, an Star Picture Palace. Ar an bPríomhshráid a bhí sé idir na blianta 1919 agus 1923. Bhí sé taobh thiar den áit a bhfuil Patrick Fahy's Gift and Hardware Shop anois.

Chasadh ceoltóirí na háite a bhí go mór faoi thrácht foinn tobchumtha mar thionlacan le léiriú na scannán i bpictiúrlanna balbha na 1920í. Bainfidh Hopkins feidhm as an spás atá ann fós le mír de shaothar scannáin a chomórann Grace Delaney, an Pianadóir áitiúil a chasadh sa phictiúrlann. Seinnfear ann saothar nua ceoil a coimisiúnaíodh go huathúil le gar-gar-iníon Grace is a thagraíonn do 'Knocknagow', scannán Éireannach ón mbliain 1918, an chéad scannán a léiríodh sa Star Cinema.

Is mian leis an gcumasachd athchóirithe spráúil seo de bhalbhscannáin is de cheol mór a dhéanamh de cheoltóirí na háite a chasadh anseo agus stair cheilte phictiúrlannaíochta an fhoirgnimh seo a nochtadh. Castlebar is a well established town with a long recorded history. But some of that history has fallen out of memory. Time has the unusual ability to erode certainty. Things that were definite, that were permanent; stone structures, heaving behemoths of industry, spaces of social exchange, artistic production and dissemination can be dissolved and erased as if they never existed. For memory is a moveable feast. But for an artist, memory is always a rich and fertile ground, an ever-changing multi layered landscape. Our hidden, our ignored, our overlooked once reimagined can uncover gems of knowledge and emotional archeology. In the Looking we have the Finding. All the artists participating in this project have undertaken a journey of excavation, jumped into the cracks of time and come out with a memory-map of unusual complexity. Some of them re-enact or re-stage memory. Some re-awaken space memory. Some play with word memory, some bathe us in colour memory or stir up sound memory. Not only have the artefacts of past peoples, past communities, past rituals, past industries been exposed to our contemporary lens but so too have the banal and the redundant been reborn and re-imagined. By their sensitive investigations and their research but most of all by their each adding their own individual visions, the artists of FIND have really reawakened the memory of a town and illuminated the shadows of its history. Their forays into the hidden and the overlooked have born much fruit, not just for these venturers but indeed for the people and community of Castlebar, for truth and beauty, past and present certainties, are waiting to be questioned and uncovered. All you have to do is FIND them.

We create pieces in response to the belief that what is often seen as the initial dynamism of public artworks often quickly becomes lost or these pieces fade into the surrounding scenery solely through their existence as static objects. We have seen that after a period of time one becomes acclimated to almost anything new no matter how large, gestural, or site specific, therefore all of our projects are created to act in response to or interaction with the public changing over time or existing solely as temporary interventions.
